
June's passenger traffic is the highest in 19 years

(YoY, Thousands)





116.5% Recovered



(YoY, Thousands)




In June, ultra-low-cost carriers served 18% of total passengers

With announcements by several airlines, PIT now has nonstop service to 62 destinations with 171 peak-day departures



(Pounds, Millions)







A more inclusive PIT means greater access to air travel for more passengers. This keeps airfares affordable, which encourages travel and commerce, increasing PIT's economic impact.















Construction on the new PIT has reached 70% completion as we advance toward more milestones this month





The new terminal's terrazzo flooring continues to be applied, ground and finished




Single- and double-floor escalators are being installed, eventually helping to deliver a more efficient passenger experience


