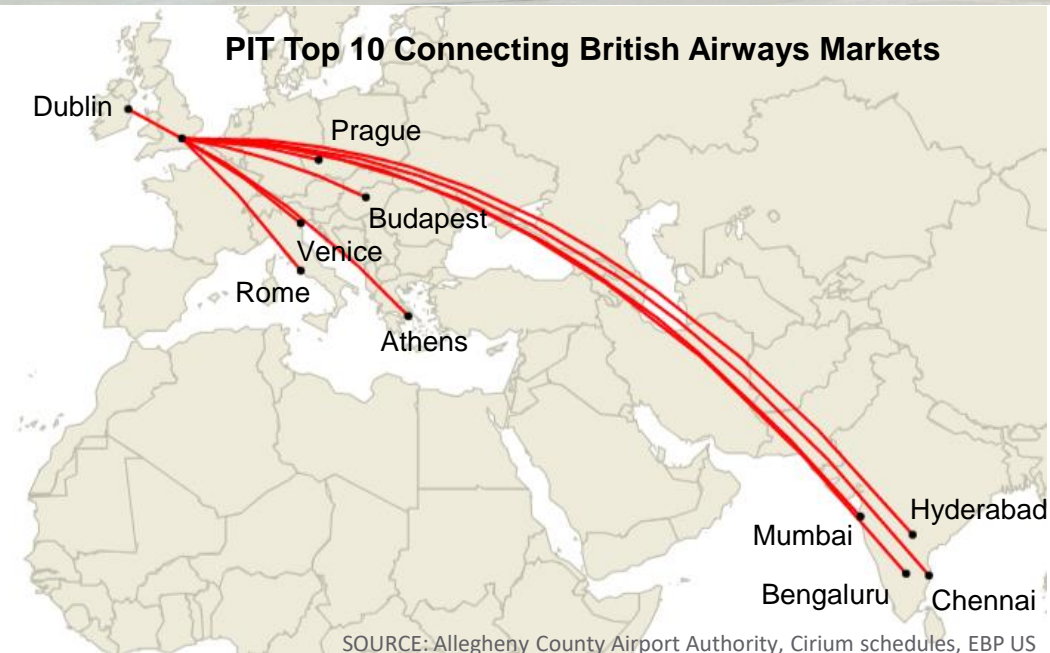

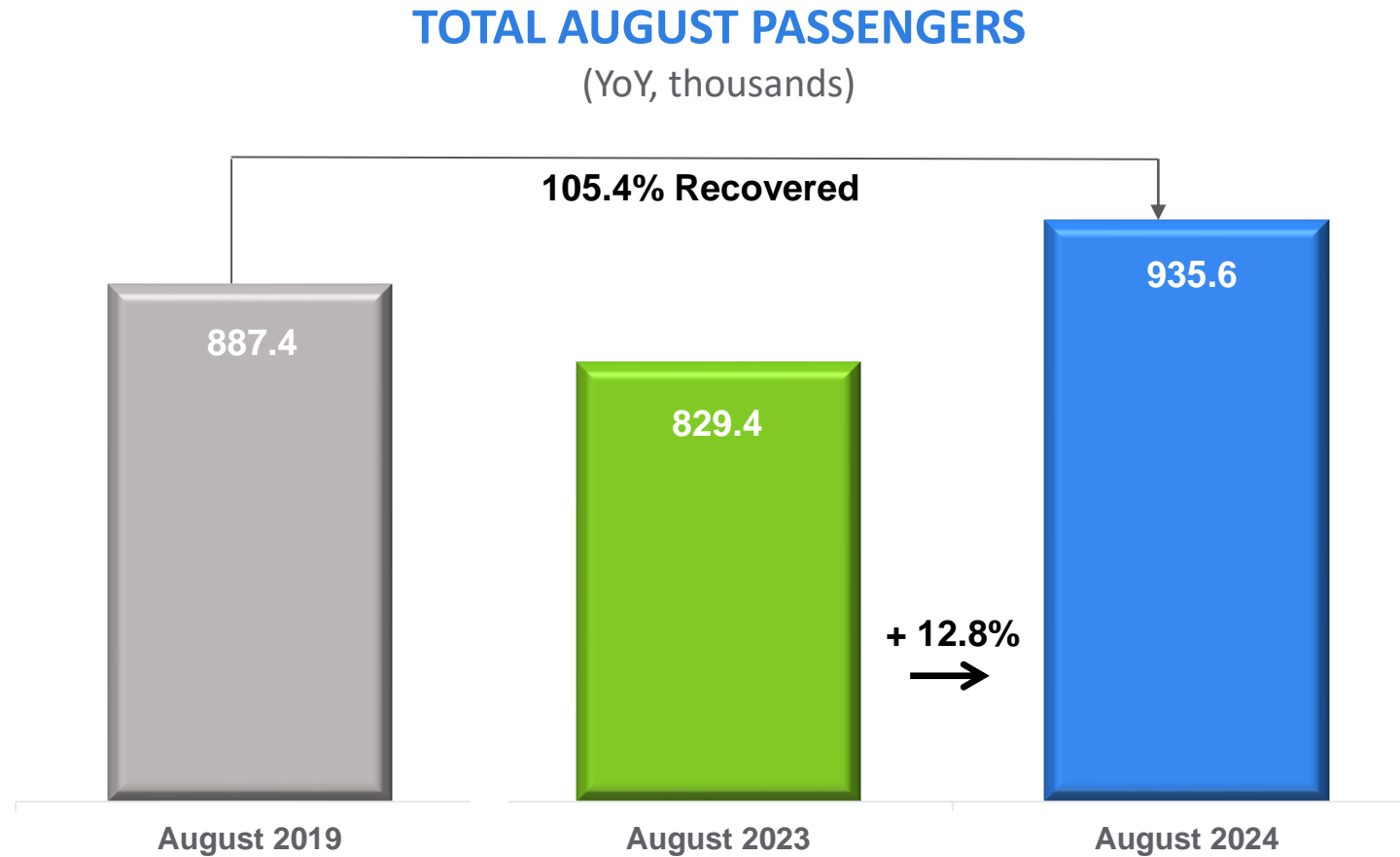

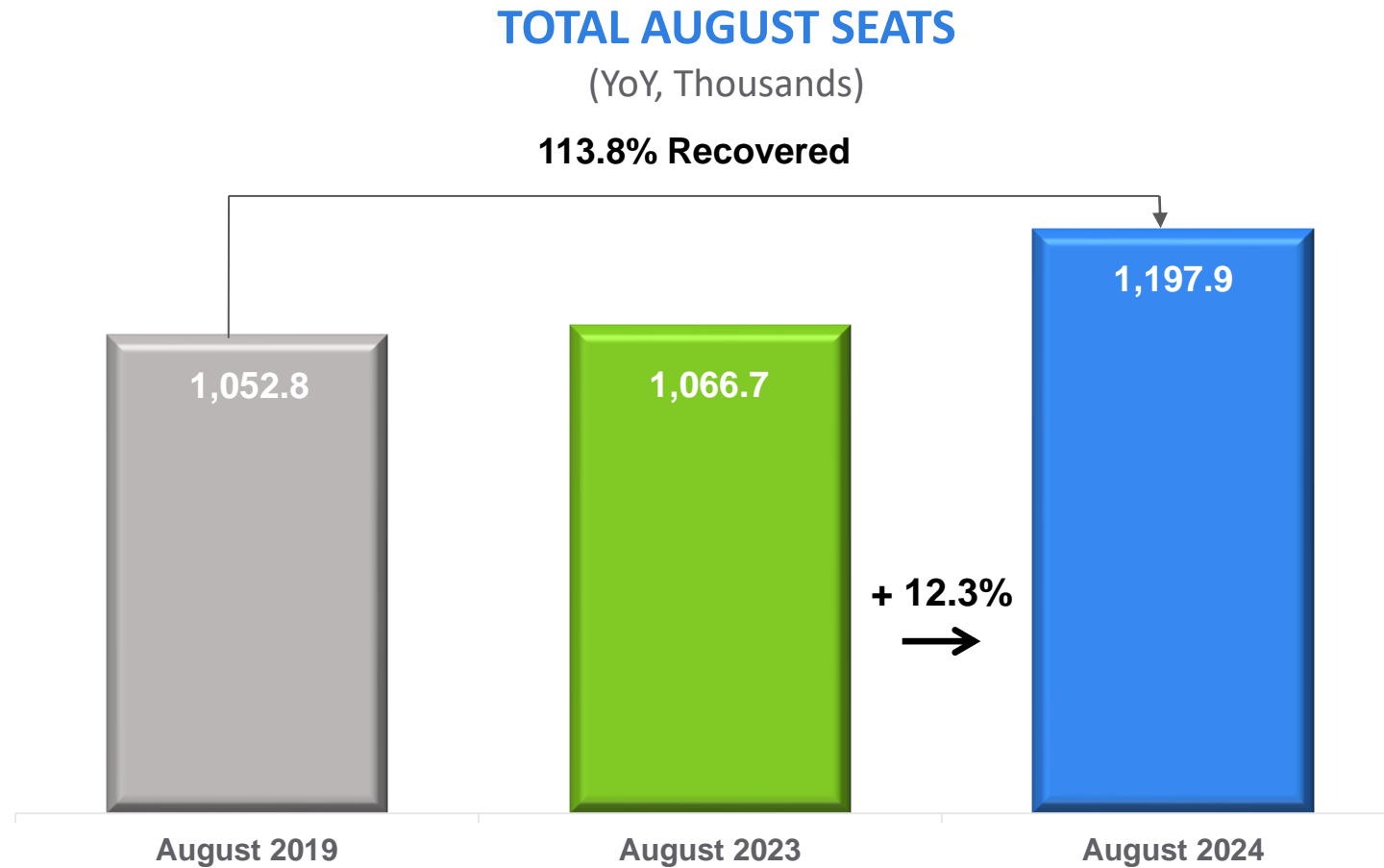
Driven by strong travel demand, passenger traffic at PIT was the busiest August since 2005

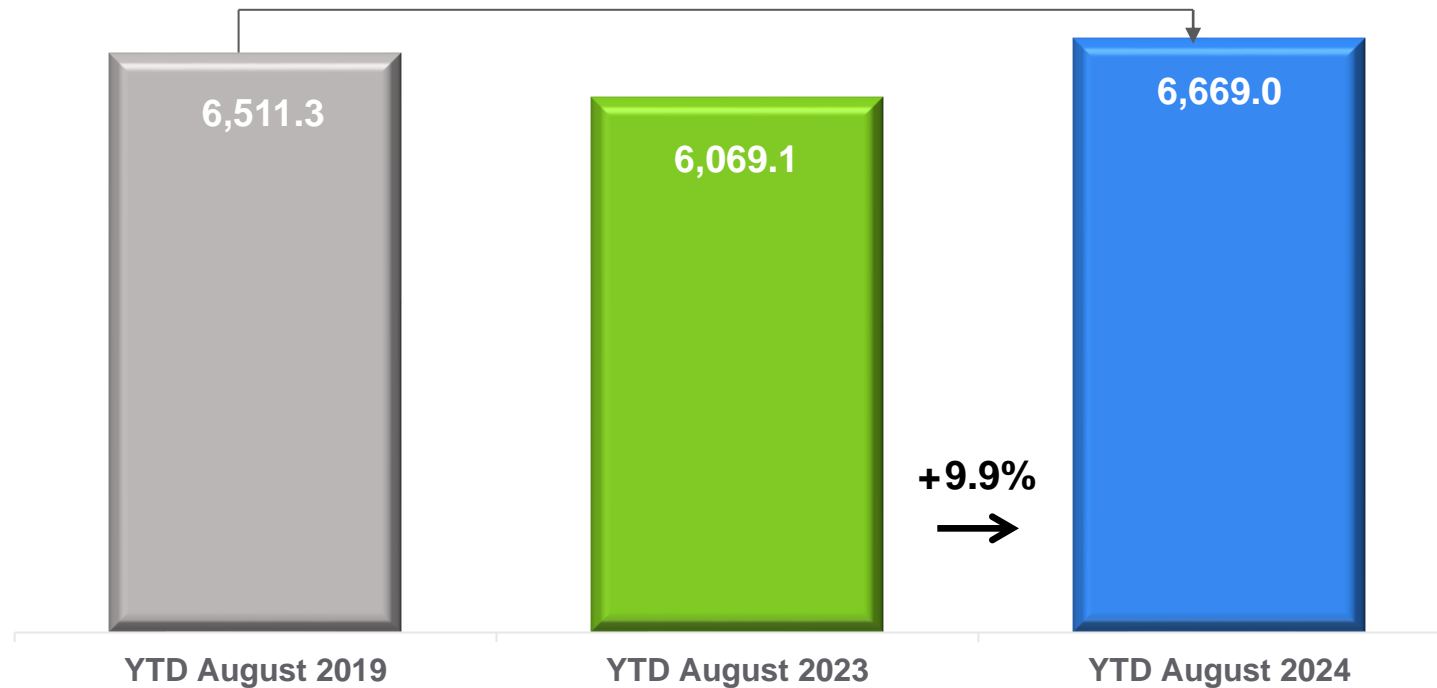


Year-to-date passenger traffic is the busiest since 2007

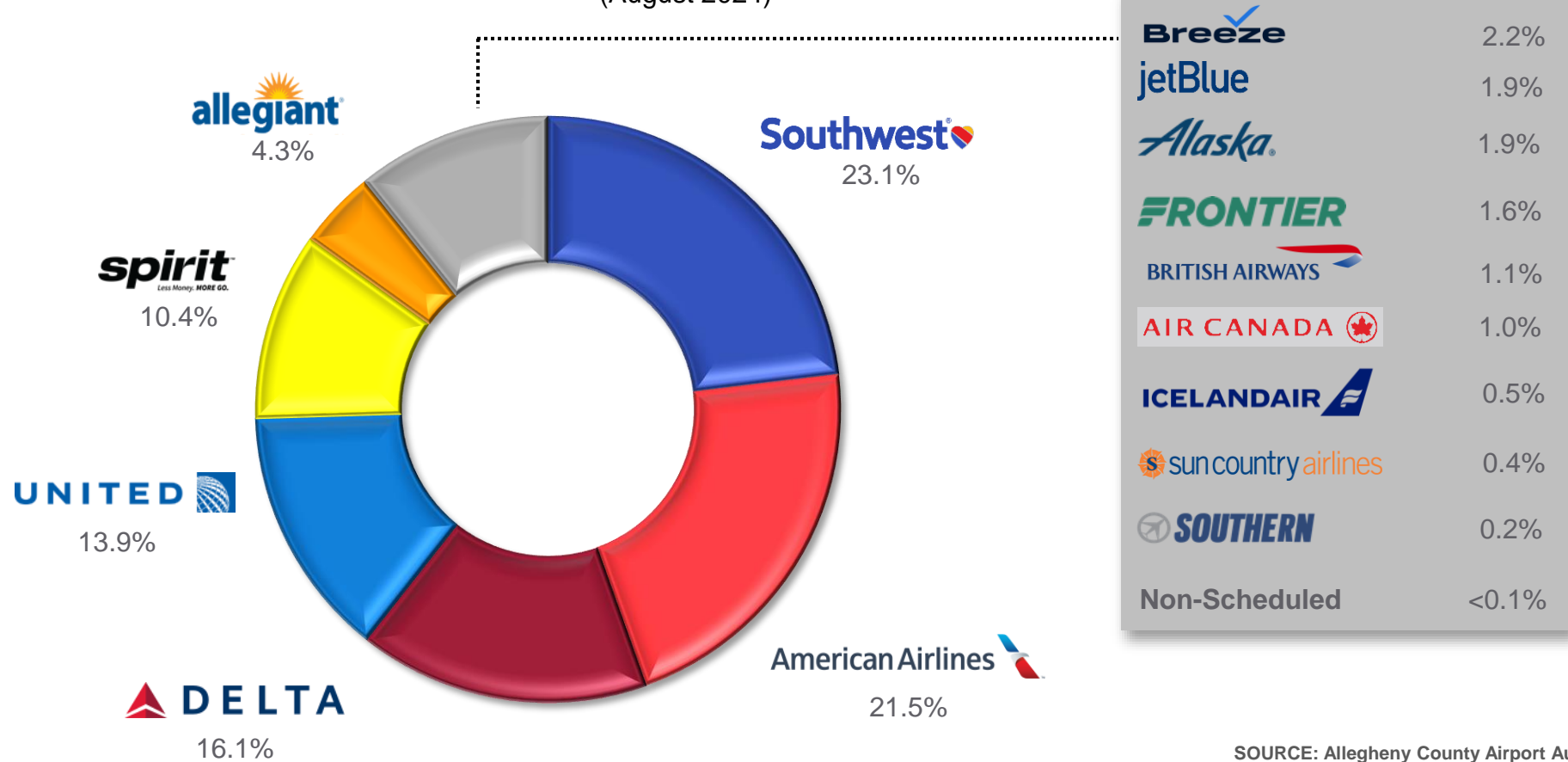

Southwest has been the leading air carrier by market share at PIT since January 2023

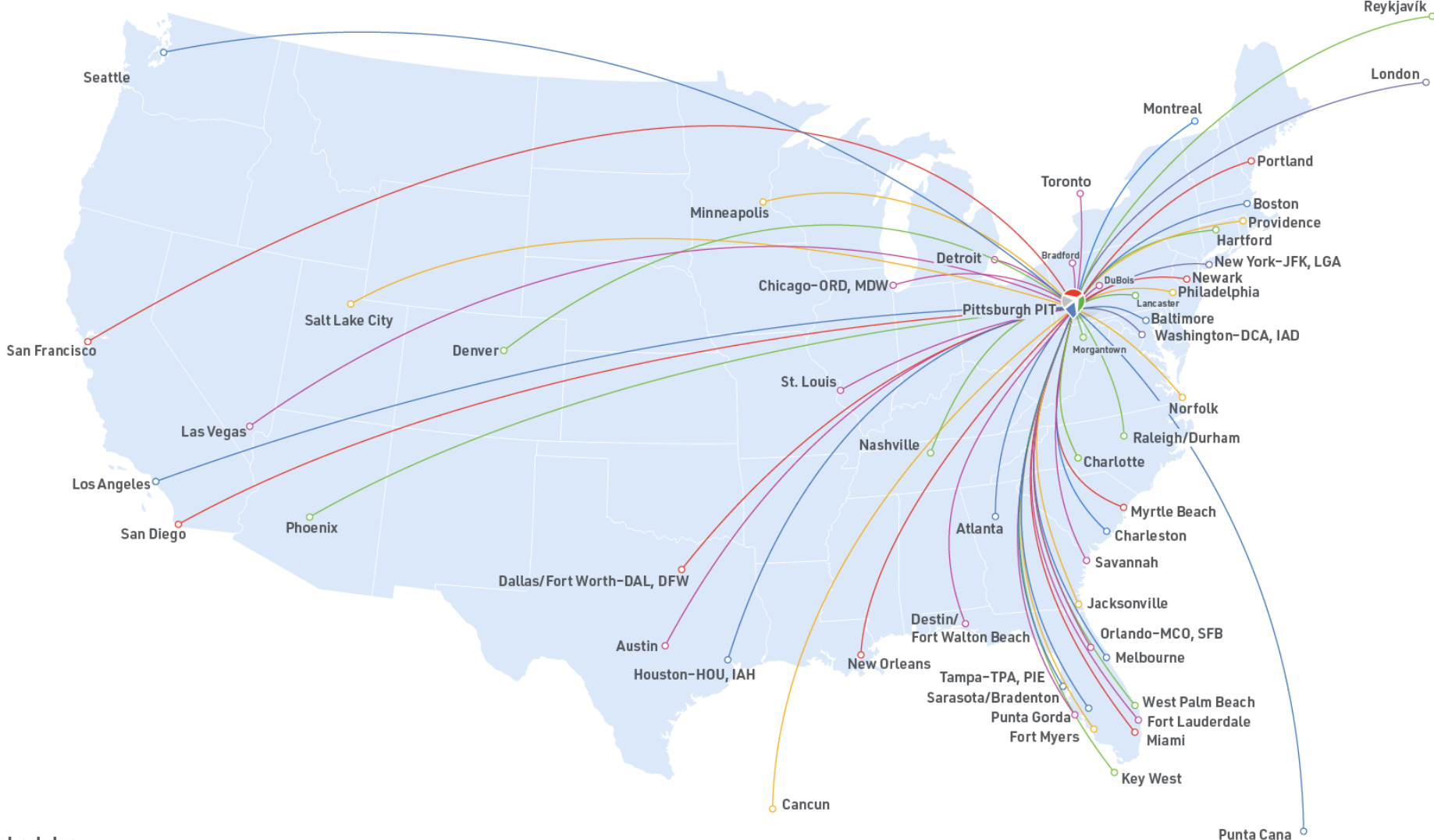
PIT PASSENGER SHARE BY CARRIER

ALLEGHENY COUNTY AIRPORT

93 Years of Flight



ACG has played an important role in the region's aviation history since the early 20th century

October 1928: A special committee of the Allegheny County Chamber of Commerce approved the site and location of a new airport in West Mifflin.

September 11, 1931: Dedicated and built at a cost of \$3.5 million, AGC was the 3rd largest airport in the U.S. and possibly the largest paved airport in the world at the time of its opening.

1939-1945: AGC was considered a strategic military base during WWII, with 60% of U.S. population living within 300 miles of the airport.

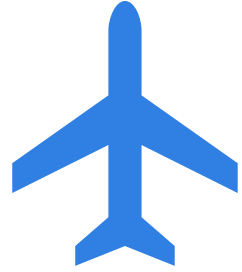
Present Day: AGC serves as the primary FAA-designated general aviation reliever airport for Pittsburgh International Airport.
