### CORE CONSTRUCTION ESCALATES



We're thrilled to announce that our new center core is starting to take shape – and we mean *literally* taking shape!

Here's a sneak peek at what's coming: arriving passengers will now enter the current airside building on what we call the **mezzanine level**. From there, they can take either an escalator or an elevator one floor down to reach their gates.

Passengers already in the terminal will also be able to use these same elevators and escalators to access this new level, where we'll soon offer exciting new amenities and concessions. Whether you're arriving or just passing through, there will be plenty to explore!

Although construction on the center core has been ongoing for nearly a year, we've reached a major milestone. The steel framing for the elevators is now being installed (as seen in the photo to the left), and the escalators will be going in shortly! The transformation is truly underway!

The rendering on the right shows what this area will look like when finished – featuring the stunning '**Sky Beneath Our Feet**' flooring, which is being carefully protected during construction to ensure it shines when the core is complete.
