A New Year, A New Airport – January 2, 2025

As 2025 has arrived, the new Pittsburgh International Airport nears completion with significant progress made in 2024. Crews have focused on finishing the new terminal, customer service building, and parking garage. Key milestones include the installation of escalators, the testing of the advanced baggage system, and the addition of design elements like constellation lights and terrazzo floors. In April, the Multi-Modal Complex (MMC) reached a key milestone with its topping-out ceremony. The Customer Service Building, designed to connect passengers from the MMC to the terminal, also saw major progress, with walls, glass and roofing added this year. At the same time, the airside terminal received a major facelift. New bathrooms and passenger hold rooms were completed and opened to the public, offering travelers a glimpse of the enhanced facilities to come.
